## **Ideas for Writing a Paper**

Much of the debate surrounding organ donation in the Orthodox Community stems from the question of when death occurs in Jewish law. Most organs are taken from people who are braindead. Many Rabbis believe that since the heart is artificially kept alive then the person is alive, even though the brain is not functioning. They forbid organ donation in this case because they think it would be "killing" the donor.
